

There has been an increase in the number of clients attending on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. On these days we accommodate up to 14 persons each day. These have been current and previous clients and includes clients from the Refuge of Hope night shelter.

The clients continue to receive care packages on Fridays, which includes rice, toiletries etc. (Whatever is available)

There is now a new Intake Form and Permission Slip for Social Media and all forms have been completed and placed in their respective folders.

The office and the store rooms are now de-cluttered and the space now has a new look.

Our visiting volunteer Psychologist made her first visit to CUMI on June 4 since the COVID 19 pandemic and 4 clients were counselled.

Representatives from the National Council on Drug Abuse visited CUMI and did a presentation on the use of drugs. The response was well received and the clients encouraged them to make frequent visits.

A list of attendees requiring assistance with transportation was sent to the Treasurer in order to set up a slush fund.

The Burchell Baptist Church continues to assist with lunches every 1st Monday of each month and they now host devotion with the clients and CUMI staff every 1st and 3rd Friday of each each month. The Church of Jesus Christ hosts devotion every 1st Monday of each month.

The Jamaica for Jesus Group visited CUMI on April 4th. The clients were enthused during the visit as they engaged in various indoor and outdoor social activities. They all received gifts and had a wonderful day.

There has been a 2.2% increase in our followers on Instagram and in the last 30bdays we've reached 70 new accounts.

CUMI is now available on Google Live Pages as CUMI Day Rehabilitation Centre. Since it's inception in March we have had 674 views, 184 of which has been Business Profile Interactions, 7 telephone calls and 8 website visits have been made through this live page.
